

aerial systems. This would be located in the College of Engineering and Mines and there is expected growth in this field with job growth for future graduates. There are 3 concentration tracks; Aeronautical Engineering, Space Systems, and Unmanned Aerial Systems. This program will need two new Faculty hires. We received \$200,000 from the Governor's Initiative to help fund this and in time, the projected revenue from the tuition will also offset program costs. Paul will bring this to the Board of Regents in May.
