With meet ng set ngs in the Zoom web portal and the Zoom applicat on, securing your Zoom Meet ngs can start before your event even begins.



One of the best ways to secure your meet ng is to turn on Zoom's Wait ng Room feature. Some Zoom users, like those in educat on, will have this feature turned on by default. This feature provides a virtual wait ng room for your at endees and allows you to admit individual meet ng part cipants into your meet ng at your discret on.

Users can enable Wait ng Room as a default account set ng, for individual meet ngs, or as a meet ng template.

Once your Zoom Meet ng is of and running you'll have access to a number of helpful features that put you in total control.



Allowing part cipants to screen share in a meet ng can be a great way to collaborate, but that can also leave you open to unwanted interrupt ons during larger meet ngs.

Zoom gives you the ability to determine if you want other part cipants in the meet ng to be able to share their screens, or if you want to be the only one with that

We've all been in meet ngs where somebody forgets to mute, or their microphone picks up some background noise that interrupts the meet ng. Zoom allows you to solve this problem with a simple but on to mute all part cipants. For an added layer of security, you can also disable part cipant's ability to unmute themselves. When you're ready to make the meet ng interact ve again, you can simply hit the "Unmute All" but on or allow part cipants to unmute themselves.

All the features we've covered so far are only accessible to meet ng hosts, ensuring that hosts are the only ones with total control over a meet ng.
